Secretary's Notes

Some of the dealers at the recent NCNA Convention and Coin Show asked me to explain how the NCNA membership dues paid with their table fees is applied.

If you are an active member of the NCNA and your dues are paid for the current year, then your dues payment is credited toward next year's dues. If you have not paid your dues before June 30th of the year in which they are due your membership is changed to inactive status and your name is removed from the mailing lists. If you pay your dues at the NCNA show with your table fees and your membership status is inactive, then your dues payment is applied to the current year and your membership is moved to the active status and returned to the mailing list. Any member that has not paid their dues by June 30th becomes an inactive member and they have until December 31st to pay their dues or lose their membership in the NCNA.

Currently, the dues notices for memberships that expire on December 31^{st} are mailed out in early December. If payment is not received by March 1^{st} a final notice for dues payment is sent out. Then if the dues are not paid by June 30^{th} , the member is moved to inactive status and removed from the mailing list.

A note has been added to the membership application. Pursuant to the NCNA bylaws, the Family Membership requires two adults 18 years of age or older at the same mailing address. As a result, the names of the names of the two adults and all children will need to be listed separately to be included on the membership rolls as a family membership.

ARTICLE II: MEMBERSHIP - ELIGIBILITY

SECTION 4 - FAMILY MEMBERSHIP - FAMILY MEMBERS SHALL BE TWO INDIVIDUALS EIGHTEEN-YEARS-OF AGE OR OLDER. THEY WILL BE ASSIGNED APPROPRIATE MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS BY THE SECRETARY. THE TWO INDIVIDUALS MUST RESIDE TOGETHER; ANY OTHER MEMBERS RESIDING AT THE SAME LOCATION WILL BE PLACED IN ANOTHER MEMBERSHIP CATEGORY.

My Winning Fractional Currency Exhibit

I came across a piece of Fractional Currency on a buying trip North and became interested in the history as I was not familiar with the series. That started my journey into this unique series of US currency.



Fractional Currency is the shortest and most unique era of U S Currency. It grew out of the necessity to find a replacement for metal coinage that was hoarded and even sent out of the country during the Civil War. The steps taken to produce a method of making change grew from postage stamps, and finally to currency that was authorized by the government.



One of the most informative books I used in my research was by Robert J. Kravitz, *A Collector's Guide to Postage and Fractional Currency*. Another book that I found quite useful is *Kenneth Bressett's Official Red Book of United States Currency*. I also found a copy of *Milton R*. *Friedberg's, Encyclopedia of United States Fractional and Postal Currency* to be very helpful. This book has been out of publication for several years.

During the time I was researching the fractional series, I became interested in the Specimen Notes that were created to help ward off counterfeiting. The specimens are printed on one side only and were usually attached to a "shield" which was sold to banks and merchants for comparison to the currency that was being spent to verify authenticity. Some were produced with wider margins and sent out as "packets" for the same purpose.

Some of the early postage currency was not supported by the Treasury and was not considered legal tender. There were also some laws changed during this time regarding our currency, one of them being that no living person could be depicted on the currency.

Guy Clark Awarded 2013 Ted Hendrick Memorial Dealer Award

Guy Clark, long-time dealer in ancient coins and other antiquities, was awarded the 2013 *Ted Hendrick Memorial Dealer Award* at the recent annual convention of the North Carolina Numismatic Association (NCNA). The award is sponsored and managed by the Raleigh Coin Club (RCC).



The award was established in memory of Ted Hendrick, one of the instrumental early leaders of both the RCC and NCNA. It is meant to recognize numismatic dealers who conduct business in the State of North Carolina and give back to the hobby through their honest dealings and their service to collectors. A key element of the award is the willingness of a dealer to help educate collectors.

Nominations for the award were sought from coin clubs across the state as well as individual members of either the NCNA or RCC. Dave Provost, the RCC Hendrick Award Committee Chair, stated "Of the nominations considered for the award, Guy Clark's clearly stood out. He received the strongest and most passionate support."

Here are just some of the comments received in support of Guy's nomination:

"He is a shining example of selfless sharing of numismatic knowledge with collectors new or advanced."

"Guy has a deep grasp of history and the coinage associated with each culture. I learn something new every time that I visit his table."

"He has always been ready to teach new collectors about ancient coins and their history, and is willing to spend as much time with kids as he is with paying customers."

"Guy has given countless coins away to kids as his way of letting them hold history in their hands."

"Guy Clark has been a tireless goodwill ambassador for not just ancient coin dealers but all coin dealers. Coin dealers would gain much by emulating his goodwill practices."

Guy was announced as the winner of the Hendrick Award at

the annual NCNA banquet; the banquet followed the closing of the bourse on the second day of the convention. He was present to accept the award and received a standing ovation while doing so. Guy was honestly surprised by the recognition and was visibly moved by it. He accepted the award with his customary humility.

Installments of the series focused on wooden money in North Carolina and also medals marking historic events in the state such as the passing of The Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence, which was passed several months before the Continental Congress approved the U.S. Declaration of Independence.

The Bason Literary Award is given annually in memory of Autence and Baxter Bason of Greensboro and their family for journalistic contributions to the hobby, particularly contributions to the NCNA Journal. However, journalistic achievements in other areas that advance the hobby also are considered.

The winner is determined each year by the Bason Literary Award Committee or members of the NCNA board of directors. Nominations for the award are received each year from the board of directors and the general membership, however, writers whose articles are published in the Journal are automatically nominated for the award.

NCNA Presents Multiple YN Programs

Mr. Rodney Bobak and Charles Lambert offered four (two each) Young Numismatist Programs to approximately twenty YN's and their parents.

Rodney's program was called the Greensboro Mint. He made blank planchets (discs of metal to be stamped as a coin) from lead. He used an anvil die and a ball peen hammer to strike the blank. The reverse featured a stick figure of a pine tree and the legend NORTH CAROLINA IN GREENSBORO. The Obverse featured the letter G (for Greensboro), the date 2013 and the Roman Numerals XII. Yes, the numerals should have read XIII but on the bright side the YN's got an error coin! Around the edge of the coin reads Nor Caro Numis Assoc YN.

Charles offered a coin program to enhance the YN skills of identifying dates and mint marks on Lincoln Memorial Cents by having the YN's work on filling Whitman folders that were donated to the NCNA. The YN's were also provided with explanations on the detection of the double dies of 1972, 1983, 1984, and 1995. Special attention was also given the close and wide AM varieties of 1999.
