You are invited to present a part of your collection via an educational exhibit at the NCNA Convention and Show to be held at the Cabarrus Arena and Events Center in Concord, North Carolina. The show is open to the public Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Exhibit Rules

- 1. Exhibiting is open to all members of the NCNA in good standing including directors and board members. Non-members wishing to exhibit may join the NCNA prior to the Convention to gain eligibility.
- 2. The Young Numismatist category is open to those under 18 years of age or younger as of the first day of the Convention. Young Numismatists (YNs) are encouraged to exhibit!
- 3. Exhibits are to have a numismatic or philatelic theme, in good taste.
- 4. All exhibited material must be the property of the exhibitor.
- 5. All exhibits must be prepared and set up by the exhibitor. An agent for an exhibitor may set up and/or take down an exhibit if prior arrangements are made with the Exhibit Chair.
- 6. Any exhibited material known to be a copy or replica must be labeled as such. Failure to do so will disqualify an exhibit from receiving an award.
- 7. The exhibitor should not be identified in the exhibit; exhibits are not to include the exhibitor's name, image or any other material specifically identifying him or her.
- 8. Exhibits may be set up on the Thursday prior to show opening, between 2:00pm and 8:00 pm or on Friday or Saturday between 8:00 and 10:00 am. All exhibits must be in place by 10:00 am Saturday. It is highly encouraged to set up exhibits in a timely manner to be available for the public on Friday, see #9.
- 9. Voting by the public for a "Peoples Choice" will be on Friday and Saturday.
- 10. Exhibits may not be removed before Noon on Sunday, unless special permission is obtained from the Exhibit Chair.
- 11. Exhibits must be removed by 4:00pm on Sunday. YNs may remove their exhibits at the close of the show on Saturday.
- 12. Exhibit cases will be furnished upon request; however, an exhibitor may furnish his or her own case(s). The interior dimensions of the cases available from the NCNA are approximately 20-3/4" by 32-3/4".
- 13. An exhibitor may enter more than one exhibit, but no more than three. The maximum number of cases per exhibitor is ten (10). The Exhibits Chair reserves the right to limit the number of exhibits or the case count per exhibiter based on the number of exhibit applications received.
- 14. "People's Choice" awards will be presented to YN and adult exhibits garnering the most votes from Convention attendees. Public voting by ballot will be on Friday & Saturday. Awards may be a certificate or other prize.
- 15. In case of disputes, the decisions of the Exhibit Chair are final.
- 16. The North Carolina Numismatic Association will provide 24-hour bourse floor security, but all exhibits are displayed at the risk of the owner. The North Carolina Numismatic Association assumes NO liability for loss of or damage to any items exhibited.
