Many great items were listed for the auction, with the 10% buyer's premium going to support our Young Numismatist Program.

Jeff McCauslin provided another excellent Young Numismatist Program at the convention, with enthusiastic young collectors and their parents enjoying the numerous exhibits, activities, and prizes. Jeff has coordinated the NCNA YN Program for the past few years, and we want to thank him again for his energy and time in promoting the hobby with our future coin collectors. Since the 2018 Convention, though, Jeff has passed the YN Coordinator "baton" to Bob Pedoslky. We are very excited to have Bob aboard in 2019, as he has several years of experience working with the young numismatists in the Charlotte Coin Club.

I also want to thank those who volunteered to help with public and dealer registration. The Charlotte Coin Club was well represented as they had several volunteers step up. Everyone's efforts contributed greatly to a smoothly run convention and show. Attendees and dealers were greeted by a very friendly and helpful group of volunteers! Special thanks also to Halbert Carmichael and Dot Hendrick for their great job in supervising the dealer check-in.

Looking forward to 2019, the NCNA leadership team is already focused on several important efforts. Areas of high priority include membership growth for the organization, expansion of the NCNA liaison with local coin clubs, and continued development of YN program activities. You will be hearing more about these programs and certainly welcome your ideas in these areas.
